Course overview and objectives

Ninth grade students focus on analytical reading and writing techniques. You will evaluate ideas, specific claims, and reasoning in a variety of rhetoric, always supporting your analysis with textual evidence. In addition, you will learn to identify and correct fallacious arguments and false claims. Students spend considerable time evaluating rhetoric and analyzing how an argument unfolds. Students acquire and use with independence academic- and domain-specific words at the college and career readiness level.
